#### ITL 502 – MULTI-DISCIPLINARY PERSPECTIVES IN ITALIAN LANGUAGE TEACHING

#### 8-12 July 2024

This 1-week seminar offered entirely in Italian provides professional development for teachers of Italian. Composed of 30 academic hours, the seminar helps participants improve their teaching strategies through the study of innovative approaches to language and culture instruction and creative ways to tackle students' learning problems. Conducted in Italian.

2 credits. Pre-requisites: Bachelors degree or 24 university credits in Italian.

**Topics:** The seminar covers theory and practice in the following areas of language teaching: Motivating students; Creativity in the language classroom; Social and emotional learning; Intercultural competence; Oral and written communication and proficiency.
